Greetings from IHM Seminary. Our second semester has ended well with graduation of eight seniors on May 12. Though they still have four years before ordination, one can already give witness to the ways they have grown in prayer, friendship with Christ, compassion toward others, and knowledge of the truth. As I prepare to move on, I take this time to reflect on my years here. When I was appointed to go to IHM seminary and serve on the faculty, one of my parishioners joked that I must have not gotten it right the first time, and so I had to go back to the seminary. I must admit that I have learned a lot more in my time here, especially about the priesthood and how to be closely related to Christ. When I first came to IHM, I felt overwhelmed and very unprepared for the task of priestly formation, and this was true again when I was named rector. However this has been a call to trust in God and not in my own abilities or knowledge, realizing that it is His seminary and He is really doing the work of formation. One of the greatest blessing has been the graces I have received through the Institute of Priestly Formation in Omaha, NE. I had the opportunity to participate in a three week program of training for seminary spiritual directors and formators, a three year program of formation in spiritual direction, prayers and priestly identity and the 30-day Ignatian retreat. All these have helped me to come to know Christ in a much deeper way as well as experience the love of God our Father. "The Father's great glory consists in loving human beings who do not deserve that love." He truly is the Father of mercies.


